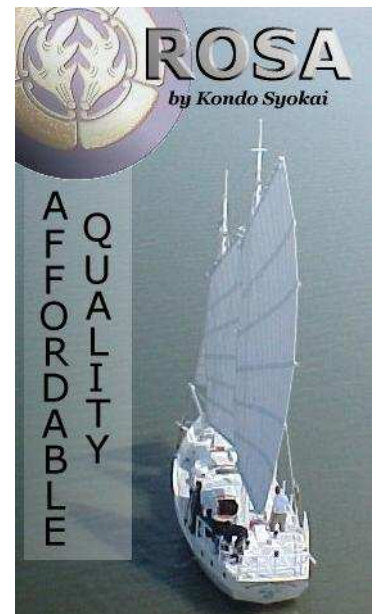
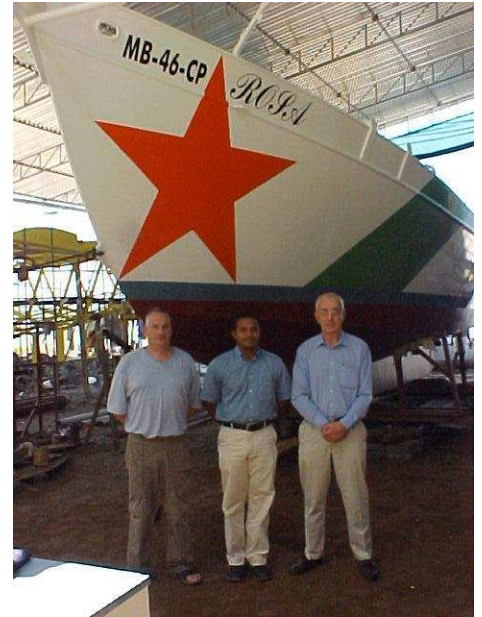
Since its formation Kondo Syokai Marine (KSM) has established a reputation for enterprise, quality and innovation which have been amply demonstrated at the Indian International Boat Show held in Cochin and at which event KSM is a regular exhibitor. The current product range includes yachts (42' ocean schooners), powerboats, decked fishing boats and sailing dinghies. KSM is also developing powered vessels of advanced design which will be available later in 2005.

KSM is made up of a highly skilled workforce, technical staff and consultants who have recently demonstrated their outstanding talents by successfully building and sailing the first recreational yacht to be built and registered in India. KSM is skilled in all aspects of small ship building and repair and has competencies in steel, wood and FRP manufacture. KSM employs foreign technical staff as required - for example the first yachts from KSM were built under the supervision of British shipwrights.

KSM has 2 boatyards - the Mattencherry Yard and the Kannamaly Yard. The Mattencherry Yard has deep water berths and rails for the hauling and repair of large vessels of up to 80 feet length. The Kannamaly Yard has 4 covered fabrication bays and all the tooling and machinery necessary for the manufacture and repair of vessels to the highest standards. KSM also has mobile blasting equipment and provides a mobile blasting and painting service.

KSM is currently engaged in the manufacture and repair of several yachts - including foreign vessels which demands the highest levels of craftsmanship and professionalism. KSM was also engaged on the repair of the Indian Navy sail training vessel, Tarangina.

KSM has recently been engaged by Rotary International to provide replacement fishing boats for the victims of the Asian Tsunami in Tamil Nadu. This follows on from success in manufacturing and supplying 2 replacement fishing boats earlier this year from monies donated by Rotary and the UK Defence School of Electrical and Mechanical Engineering
